- Feel and show empathy


There will be an increased focus on Social Emotional Learning in collaboration with The Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL).

## Another way to look at grades:

# Grading and Assessments

## Just like riding a bike!

- Requires considerable support when demonstrating understanding
  - Demonstrates limited understanding of content taught
  - Makes frequent errors when demonstrating concepts

- Requires moderate support when demonstrating understanding
  - Demonstrates partial understanding of content taught
  - Makes some errors or omissions demonstrating concepts taught

- Requires limited support when demonstrating understanding
  - Demonstrates a general understanding of content taught
  - Makes few errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts taught



- Requires no support
  - Demonstrates a thorough understanding of content taught
  - Makes no major errors or omissions when demonstrating concepts taught



## Grades in 2nd Grade

In other words, the "4, 3, 2, 1" scoring in 2nd grade does NOT equate to letter grades or percentages.

The "4, 3, 2, 1" scoring reflects your child's understanding and ability to apply what they have learned.


